**Frank Fallon, N2FF, Director
Hudson Division, ARRL**

TOPIC: Threats to Amateur Radio in 2003

Frank Fallon, N2FF, is the ARRL Director for the Hudson Division, representing almost 9,000 ARRL members in Northern New Jersey, Eastern New York, and the New York City and Long Island section. As one of 15 "member elected" Directors of ARRL, The National Organization for Amateur Radio, he attends many national meetings representing local area Amateur Radio operators. He was one of four ARRL Directors elected by other Directors to the ARRL Executive Committee, which makes policy decisions for the organization between semi annual board meetings. He has been the chairman of the Membership Services Committee, which administers the ARRL contests and awards programs such as DXCC and is a member of the Elections Committee and the Antenna Tower Committee, which recommends test cases to the full board for funding. He currently serves on the Administration and Finance Committee, which oversees ARRL programs and spending.

Frank's meetings are always lively, interesting, and to the point. His comments on the proposal to transmit wide band internet access over the power lines should be especially interesting. (Total interference to **all** HF services from power line radiation, not just Amateur Radio). Topics like this one should make for a lively meeting, so lets give Frank a good turnout!

Field Day 2003 Results

Hi All,

Well I am now well rested but not ready to do it all over again just yet. SARA's entry was mailed on July 24th, 5 days early of the deadline.

We made 1675 QSO's; 771 on CW, 2 digital, 902 on phone. By band, the breakdown is as follows:

Phone beat CW in volume but CW beat phone in points (they're worth double). 20M CW just barely beat out 40M CW and rumor has it that Carl (K2YR) lowered Joe's (K2UF) antenna after it got dark. Band conditions were terrible and we never heard any 10M or 6M openings.

Dennis and crew managed to squeak out 46 QSO's on 6M anyway. We got 500 bonus points for emergency power, 100 points for media publicity, 100 points for the public location, 100 points for an information booth, 100 points for 5 natural power QSO's, 100 points for the visit by Dan Fiorello, 100 points for the visit by Paul Zonderman W2PZ), and 100 points for demonstrating APRS. We missed an easy 100 points for not copying the ARRL Field Day Message, missed 100 points for not sending a Field Day Message to our SM, and missed 100 points for not making a satellite QSO. If we had made 100 GOTA QSO's, we would have netted another 100 bonus points in addition to the points for their QSO's. There's always next year. Do I hear any volunteers for Field Day Chairman 2004???

We all had fun and that is the main thing. We had a great, larger than normal, turnout - I estimated 60 for our ARRL entry.
